The drugs represented have been reviewed by *Neighborhood Health Providers* and are approved for inclusion. The *Formulary* is reflective of current medical practice as of the date of review. There may be occasions when an unlisted drug is desired for medical management of a specific patient. The information contained in this *Formulary* and its appendices is provided solely for the convenience of medical providers. ## PREFACE

The *Neighborhood Health Providers CHP Formulary* is organized by sections. Each section is divided by therapeutic drug class primarily defined by mechanism of action. Products are listed by generic name with brand name for reference only. Unless exceptions are noted, generally all applicable dosage forms and strengths of the drug cited are included in the *Formulary*. Generics should be considered the first line of prescribing, and all generics will be covered on the *Formulary*.

Individual pharmacy benefit plans may impose restrictions or not reimburse some products. In addition, over-the-counter (OTC) products, with the exception of insulin and diabetes monitoring products, are usually not included in the pharmacy benefit. OTC products are listed for informational purposes.

Drugs represented in the *Formulary* may have varying cost to the plan participant. Generic medications typically are available at the lowest cost, brand-name medications on the *Formulary* will generally cost more than generics, and brand-name medications not on the list will generally cost the most.

## DRUG LIST PRODUCT DESCRIPTIONS

To assist in understanding which specific strengths and dosage forms are on the *Neighborhood Health Providers CHP Formulary*, examples are noted below. The general principles shown in the examples can usually be extended to other entries in the book. Any exceptions are noted.

**Products on the *Formulary* include all strengths and dosage forms of the cited brand-name product.**

*zolmitriptan*

*Zomig*

Tablets, orally-disintegrating tablets, nasal spray and all strengths of Zomig would be covered by this listing.

**When a strength or dosage form is specified, only the specified strength and dosage form is on the *Formulary*. Other strengths/dosage forms of the reference product are not.**

*ciprofloxacin susp*

*Cipro Susp*

The brand-name suspension formulation is on the *Formulary*, but the brand-name tablets are not.

**Extended-release and delayed-release products require their own entry.**

*bupropion ext-rel*

*Wellbutrin XL*

The long-acting product Wellbutrin SR is not on the *Formulary* based upon the Wellbutrin XL entry. Similarly, the brand-name product Wellbutrin immediate-release is not on the *Formulary*.

**Dosage forms on the *Formulary* will be consistent with the category and use where listed.**

*neomycin/polymyxin B/hydrocortisone*

*Cortisporin*

Since Cortisporin is listed only in the OTIC section, coverage is limited to the otic solution and suspension. From this entry the ophthalmic solution, the ophthalmic ointment, and the topical cream cannot be assumed to be on the list unless there are entries for these products in the OPHTHALMIC and DERMATOLOGY sections of the *Formulary*.

## GENERIC SUBSTITUTION

Generic substitution is a pharmacy action whereby a generic version is dispensed rather than a prescribed brand-name product. **Boldface** type indicates generic availability. However, not all strengths or dosage forms of the generic name in boldface type may be generically available. In addition, boldface type may indicate that the brand name cited is a generic. Examples of the latter include Levoxyl and Trivora.

One way to reduce out-of-pocket cost is by requesting a generic drug. Generic drugs are usually priced lower than their brand-name equivalents. Generic drugs are:

- Approved by the U.S. Food and Drug Administration for safety and effectiveness, and are manufactured under the same strict standards that apply to brand-name drugs.
- Tested in humans to assure the generic is absorbed into the bloodstream in a similar rate and extent compared to the brand-name drug. Generics may be different from the brand in size, color, and inactive ingredients, but this does not alter their effectiveness or ability to be absorbed just like the brand-name drug.
- Manufactured in the same strength and dosage form as the brand-name drugs.

When a generic drug is substituted for a brand-name drug, you can expect the generic to produce the same clinical effect and safety profile as the brand-name drug.

## QUANTITY LIMITS

- Celebrex:** limited to #30 capsules per 30 day supply  
**Cymbalta:** 20 mg-#60 capsules per 30 days; 30 mg & 60 mg-#30 capsules per 30 days  
**Enablex:** limited to #30 units per 30 days  
**Migraine agents:** dosage limitations - see table below  
**Proton Pump inhibitors:** limited to #30 units per 30 days, except Prilosec OTC, which is limited to #60 capsules per 30 days. These products will be subject to Step Therapy (see below).  
**Pulmicort Respules:** maximum monthly dosage equals #60 ampules of 1 mg/2 mL, 0.5 mg/2 mL, or 0.25 mg/2 mL  
**Relenza:** limited to 1 fill per 180 days  
**Sedatives/Hypnotics:**  
**Ambien/Ambien CR:** limited to #15 tablets/capsules per 30 day supply  
**Lunesta:** limited to #30 units per 30 days  
**Tamiflu:** limited to 1 fill per 180 days

## STEP THERAPY

**Allegra-D** will be approved after a 30 day trial of OTC loratadine or loratadine/pseudoephedrine product.

**Byetta** requires concurrent use of other diabetic agents.

**Elidel** will be covered only after trial of a topical steroid.

**Kapidex** will be approved only after a 30 day trial of Prilosec OTC 20 mg, omeprazole 10 mg, 20 mg, or pantoprazole.

**Lamisil (oral)** is covered if the member is also on diabetic agents, cancer chemotherapy agents or antiretroviral agents.

**Nexium** will be approved only after a 30 day trial of Prilosec OTC 20 mg, omeprazole 10 mg, 20 mg, or pantoprazole.

**Protopic** will be covered only after trial of a topical steroid.

**Singulair** is covered if member is also receiving asthma medications or has received oral corticosteroids in the past 180 days.

**Spiriva** will be covered only after a trial of ipratropium inhaler or nebulizer solution or albuterol/ipratropium aerosol.

**Sporanox** is covered if the member is also on diabetic agents, cancer chemotherapy agents or antiretroviral agents.

**SSRI Antidepressants** (single-source) will be covered only after trial of 60 day trial of generic 1<sup>st</sup> Line agent.
